Board of Selectmen Meeting Minutes February 7, 2024

Call Meeting to Order

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm

Minutes – the Selectboard reviewed the minutes from the January 16, 2024 meeting. The minutes has previously been approved (at the 01/24/2024 meeting), but the Board wanted to make sure the resignation letter from Chief Straight was accurate. Kling felt it was important to list the order Straight submitted documents to the Selectboard. These minutes will be reviewed again at the 02/14/2024 Selectboard meeting.

Reports for the Annual Report

- Highway Report the Selectboard reviewed the report created by Kling. Kling wanted to mention the overlay put on the Archertown Road from Route 10 to Townshed Road, and the start of Phase I to the Dublin Road Ext. In addition, he wanted to add mention of Roger Hadlock, highway crew member.
- Selectboard Report The Selectboard discussed the report created by Adams. No changes were made.

Other

- Adams attended the hearing to appoint 3 candidates to the Orford Planning Board all three were approved by the Court, and a Planning Board meeting has been scheduled for February 20, 2024. All three members will be sworn in before the meeting, and Adams will post a notice on the Orford listserv.
- Adams presented a draft of a Memorandum of Understanding between the Town of Orford and NH Broadband. A draft was presented to the other Board members to review, with further discussion at the 02/14/24 Selectboard meeting
- Kling reviewed the Budget Public Hearing held on January 30, 2024. He felt overall the
 public hearing went well with a lot of question about Phase I of the Archertown Road
 project.
- Kling asked if anyone knew what was going on at the Archertown Road-Jacobs Brooks bridge – Follensbee said the State was looking for a specific type of bat, but nothing was found. Adams said he was on a phone call with Eversource and DuBois & King to discuss the pole placements for the project – Eversource is coming up with some creative ideas.
- Kling reported the 6-Wheeler highway truck was taken to ATG in Lebanon, NH to have brakes and exhaust leaks repaired. The highway crew have been patching potholes on some of the gravel roads in town as well. They are keeping an eye on the condition of the gravel roads as the temperatures rise. So far, the roads are holding up well.
- Return of the Fire Department radio Adams said Terry Straight has not returned the radio yet, but was submitting a letter to the Board. Kling said the Board can wait for the letter, but doesn't want this to be a stalling tactic.
- Adams reported on a conversation he had with the Attorney General's office regarding
 the Selectboard acting as the Road Agent on a long-term basis. The Town is in violation
 of the Conflict of Officers regulation, as the Board can only act on a short-term basis.
 The AG office is giving the Town 30 days to come up with a resolution. Currently this is
 being handled on an informal basis, but if the Town goes beyond 30 days with no
 resolution, it will become a formal request. The complaint to the Attorney General's office
 came from Charlie Smith.

- Adams told the other Board members that he's reached out to both Jo Anne Fratus and Jennifer Carter regarding their complaints. He will address the specifics at the 02/14/24 Selectboard meeting
- Upper Valley Ambulance has hired Zackary Bryan as their new director.
